

Player's Zone Shoot Information (Read before Doubles and Singles)

- Cell phones must be off or on vibrate at all times.
- Players have 5 minutes to report to the board once called. Smokers must not hold up play

 there will be a 5-minute smoke break allowed after every other match. This will be enforced!
- Dress Code: Clean, respectable attire.

The following are not allowed: sleeveless shirts, open toe/heel shoes, hats, and headphones/earbuds. REMINDER – the dress code for provincials is strictly enforced: business casual with a collared shirt that has a minimum of a cap sleeve is required. Denim, athletic wear, shorts, skirts above the knee, open toe/heel shoes, hats, and headphones/earbuds are not allowed.

- Chalking: scores on the left and what is remaining on the right.
- It is the player's responsibility to ensure the opponent sees the finish.
- Sportsmanship: Good sportsmanship must be the prevailing attitude throughout all tournaments. Bad sportsmanship is cause for ejection from the tournament and disciplinary action will be taken. WODA has a ZERO TOLERANCE policy to ALL bad sportsmanship. Inappropriate language, verbal and/or physical abuse will not be tolerated. Concerned parties will be asked to leave and disciplinary action will be taken if warranted.
- There is no coaching in the singles event. In the doubles event, the player throwing must step off the line if requiring help from their partner.
- If asked, the scorekeeper may only inform the player what has been scored and what remains
- The order of play in each match shall be determined by a bull throw. The throwing order for the bull throw shall be determined by the toss of a coin. The winner of the bull shall throw first in leg 1 and all alternate legs as the format permits, which will also include the tie-break leg if required. The loser of the bull shall throw first in leg 2 and all alternate legs as the format permits. Each player shall throw one dart for the bull, which must be in the scoring area of the board. The dart must remain in the dartboard in order to count. If the dart enters the "25" or "bull" sector it shall be removed before the opponent takes their throw. Re-throws shall be called for if the referee cannot determine which dart is nearer the bull, or if both darts are in the Bull, or if both darts are in the '25' ring. A re-throw shall be in the reverse order of the previous throw.
- An electronic device using the application DartConnect may be used as a tool for scoring your games instead of a chalkboard.

o The electronic device scoring the game must have a charge above 30% before the start of the game/match

o Both parties must be in agreement to use DartConnect instead of the chalkboard

o The player being asked to use DartConnect may demand that someone be available to score the game/match on the electronic device. If demanded, and one is not available, the chalkboard shall be used instead

o DartConnect is the only approved electronic scoring application for zone play.

o All liability of damage to the electronic device is assumed by the person who brought the device

- Any disagreements that players cannot settle themselves must be brought to the Director; the decision for that day will be final. Issues are to be put in writing, sent to the WODA Secretary within 48 hours, and must be signed.
- Players that compete at the Provincial level are expected to attend the Nationals if they qualify. Failure to attend the Nationals may result in a 1-year suspension. Extenuating circumstances would be considered upon written presentation to the WODA executive.
- Final Shoot: The \$10 fee per person per event to play at the Provincial Championships is due at the last zone shoot.

New and Updated Rules (2024-2025 Season)

- New: Mixed Doubles There are no automatic qualifiers for the Mixed Doubles event. The teams that qualify for Provincials will be the teams in the top 50% of accumulated points from the zone shoots. The Mixed Doubles team winning first place of the top 50% will receive one (1) room night paid for each member of the Mixed Doubles team at the Provincial event.
- New: A total of sixteen (8 men and 8 ladies) qualifier spots will be added to the total Provincial qualifiers each season. These spots will be added to the specific zones that correspond to each of the sixteen (16) Team WODA members from the previous year that they played in. Example: A male player from Zone 6 made Team WODA last year, an additional qualifier spot will be added in the current season to the total number of male qualifiers in Zone 6 (the top 50% of male singles players plus one (1) more).

Updated

Final Shoot: Ties after accumulation of points from all 4 shoots must be broken with one (1) game of 200 points more than round robin play. If a player is not in attendance for a tie breaker, they automatically forfeit. Any ties after the 3rd alternate position will be broken with 9 darts high score. When a tie occurs between any players, they all must be in attendance at the last zone shoot (shoot 4) to break the tie. If they are not in attendance, they cannot qualify, even if next in line for the alternate spot.
